Gary Arthur Grisham (Action) came into this world on June 16, 1947 a bouncing baby boy with brown eyes and curly brown hair. Born to parents, Opal (Craig) and Haskell Grisham. Gary ended up in the "Oops I'm Dead" pages of the city rag (Chieftain) on July 21, 2019 having checked out on July 18 2019. Gary was deep asleep listening to a John Prine CD, Souvenirs, delivered by his brother-in-law, Tom McBride. He passed during the song "Please Don't Bury Me" (in that cold, cold ground). A gifted musician, guitarist, writer, speaker, golfer and hysterically funny, (the man made me laugh out loud our entire life).

Gary was preceded in death by his parents, Opal and Haskell Grisham. Grandparents, Craig and Grisham. Uncles Max Grisham, Lee Grisham, Ralph Lindsey and Aunts Ilo Grisham and Beth Lindsey.
